

Dear Cobham Park Church Family,

When a house is well over a hundred years old, there's reason to be wary of its condition. The roof looks fine in our 19th century farmhouse, but looks can be deceiving. How can a person know for sure? How can leaks be found? Wait for a storm—the more severe, the better. Then climb into the attic with a flashlight and discover the truth!

Something similar has happened at Cobham Park. When I joined this church over a year ago, you appeared to be a wonderful family of believers. It was easy to love you. But experience has taught me to be a little wary. A church can look great when things are going well, but its true condition only becomes evident in a storm. The last few months have certainly provided such a test. I praise God for what I've seen!

- 1. <u>Beyond external appearances, your faith is sound</u>. All the externals of church life were upended by the Coronavirus: events, meetings, buildings, offerings, ministries, pastoral visitation, etc. And yet I was constantly encouraged by your trust in God. You relied on the strength of Christ. You were not shaken. No leaks of despair or anger could be seen. You know that the Lord is our true shelter in life's storms.
- 2. <u>You've shown that you understand what a church really is</u>. The vacant church building didn't even slow you down. You instinctively knew that *you* are the church! From the very start of this crisis, you've been praying, reaching out, and helping others for Jesus Christ. You've taken initiative and proved that I'm not the only minister here—we all are! You will never know how much joy and encouragement this has given me. Thank you!
- 3. <u>The beautiful character of Jesus is shining through your lives</u>. Under pressure, it's only natural to lose patience—but you have demonstrated extraordinary patience. During this storm, I've been forced to make very difficult church decisions. The transition back to "normal" is going to be long and complicated. I fully expected a backlash no matter what I decided to do about meetings and ministry. You, however, have been nothing but supportive. You haven't been drawn into the divisive spirit which seems to dominate our country at present. You've been unselfish and kind both to me and one other. I was afraid that we might drift apart as a church family. Once again, however, God has shown Himself through you. The bond we all share wasn't broken by distance or difficulty. If anything, our mutual love is stronger than it ever has been. To tell you the truth, I'm in awe of Christ in you.
- 4. <u>You have been faithful</u>. Without your unwavering prayers, wisdom, and ministry, this church would have sunk. And without offerings, I wondered how we'd be able to pay church expenses. But your faithful giving has actually been stronger than it was before Covid-19! This defies all natural explanation, so I'm chalking it up to God's generous provision; He is so good!

Research indicates that choir rehearsals and performances create very high risk conditions. You may be aware of the church in Washington State that held a choir practice back in early March where 61 participated. Of those, 53 contracted the virus from a participant who had no symptoms. Four died.

The reason that singing is such a high risk activity is because the aerosol particles which singers emit have the capacity to travel over twenty feet, much farther than they would travel in ordinary speech. Social distancing of six feet would have little to no benefit for protecting singers from the transmission of the virus. In fact, the Baptist General Association of Virginia released Regathering Considerations on May 19, 2020 which advised churches to "Consider refraining from congregational singing, as it has been linked to increased risk of spreading the coronavirus."

This is difficult news for us! As we move forward in the immediate future, the music in our services will be limited to instrumental or vocal solos for the most part to reduce the possibility of spread within our church community. We will continue to consult the latest research and advisories from respectable sources to determine what is in the best and safest interest of our faithful choir members and our church community.

In the meantime, think about the birds of the skies. When they feel threatened by danger, they use warning cries which are strong enough to be heard at great distances. We are all probably feeling a little threatened right now, so use your voice to cry out to God! Know that your cries for help and sounds of faithful praise will be a sweet, sweet sound in your Savior's ears.

STANDING ON THE PROMISES: Tracking Abraham's Epic Faith

We'd like "instant-faith." Why does everything with God seem to take so long? We accept that an extensive home renovation will take a great deal of time and effort because the final result can be well worth it. In the same way, God is renovating our hearts, and waiting is an inevitable part of that process. But something truly wonderful will come of



this! Abraham's life helps to guide us in our own journey of faith—even when it takes longer than we expected. This month, let's together track Abraham's faith.

Let's follow these steps each day:

- 1. Take a deep breath as you ask God to speak to you. Then prayerfully read the day's scripture. Take note of the story's details. What would people have been feeling? What would this be like? Have you ever been in a similar situation? On the second day of reading, did you notice things you didn't the first time around? Each scripture reading is packed with content, so take your time. Pastor Keith plans to email devotions and post them on the church Facebook page.
- 2. Is there a particular detail that jumps out at you? Take time to ponder that.
- 3. What does this reveal about who God is? What does it reveal about Abraham-or you?
- 4. Think about the story of your life over the last 24 hours. Where did you see God?
- 5. Pray for Jesus to guide the story of your life today. Make yourself available to Him.
- 6. Ask the Lord to use you in someone else's story—a sign of His presence that others can see.
